

ABOUT THE SHOW

Ireland, 1995. Mary Robinson is President, the country is on the brink of a divorce referendum, and sex is something you get taught by the Sisters of the Holy Faith.

17 year old Eddie is shy, sensitive, and seriously stressed. He wants to be in the Army just like his dad. 17 year old Amber is fearless, ferocious and an antifascist.

She is counting the days until she can escape to London. They couldn't be more different, except for one thing—they are both hiding the same secret. So Amber

and Eddie make an arrangement that will help them impress their parents and silence the bullies. How long can they keep up the pretence? What happens if feelings get in the way? Can Eddie stop having horny dreams about his maths teacher Mr. Sweeney? Dating Amber is a teenage queer love story about beards, bodies and learning to be brave.

With an original score packed with punk, pop and 90s grunge, this work in progress sharing is a sneak peek at a joyful new musical about coming of age and coming out.

David Freyne | Writer

David Freyne is a screenwriter and director from County Kildare, Ireland. He made his feature debut with *The Cured* starring Elliott Page, which won best horror feature at Fantastic Fest, before moving to comedy drama with his second feature, *Dating Amber*, a semi-autobiographical story shot in his hometown. The film stars Fionn O'Shea, Lola Petticrew and Sharon Horgan.

David has recently finished his third feature, *Eternity*, a romantic comedy for A24, which stars Elizabeth Olsen, Miles Teller, Callum Turner and Da'Vine Joy Randolph. It is due for release in Autumn 2025.

Des Kennedy | Director and Co-Creator

Des is the Artistic Director of the Everyman in Cork.

Credits as a director include Making History [The Everyman]: Good Vibrations [Lyric Theatre Belfast, Grand Opera House Belfast and Irish Arts Center New York] [New York Times Critic's Pick]; Piaf starring Camille O'Sullivan [Gate Theatre Dublin]; Teenage Kicks [Millennium Forum Derry]; White Star Of The North [Lyric Theatre Belfast/Theatre Clwyd Cymru]; How The World Began [Out of Joint], God's Country [Tinderbox Belfast]; The Prophet Of Monto [The Flea Off-Broadway]; Woman and Scarecrow [Solas Nua]; Johnny Meister and The Stitch [Mead Theatre Lab, Washington D.C]; Dying City [Rough Magic Seeds] and Scenes from the Big Picture [Callan Theatre, Washington D.C.] which was

named one of the best 10 theater productions of the decade by Peter Marks at the Washington Post.

Associate Director credits include: Harry Potter and the Cursed Child [West End/Broadway/Melbourne/Toronto/San Francisco/Tokyo/Hamburg/Chicago]; The Glass Menagerie starring Cherry Jones [West End]; Once [West End/Dublin/Seoul]. In 2023 he was director of Little Amal's 5-day visit to Belfast.

Katie Richardson | Composer and Lyricist

Katie is a composer, sound designer, music producer and performer working across stage, screen, live and immersive projects.

As a performer, she has worked and collaborated with musicians such as Foy Vance and Duke Special as well as supporting artists like Van Morrison, Noel Gallagher's High Flying Birds, Jesca Hoop, Bell X1, All Saints and many more. For several years she was a member of Choice nominated 'Pleasure Beach' with whom she toured the UK and Ireland.

Some of her recent composition projects include: Shadowdock—an immersive, large scale, outdoor sound and light show; The Tragedy of Richard III [Lyric Theatre]; Good Vibrations [Grand Opera House Belfast and Irish Arts Centre NYC transfer]; Disco Dykes by Stacey Gregg [Outburst Festival]; and The New Electric Ballroom [Gate Theatre].

Katie has recently been elected to sit on the Ivor's Academy Senate and is currently working on several exciting screen and stage projects for 2025 and beyond.

Jack Knowles | Lighting Designer

Jennifer Rooney | Movement and Choreography

Jennifer is a choreographer and movement director with over 25 years' experience.

Her TV and film credits include Derry Girls [series 2 and 3], How to Get to Heaven from Belfast [Series 1], World on Fire [series 2], Old Friends and Other Days [Northern Ireland Opera], Flight [BBC and One Dance UK] and Lark [NI Screen].

Musical Theatre credits include Murder for Two [The MAC], Fun Home and Piaf [Gate, Dublin], Good Vibrations [Lyric Belfast and IAC New York], Into the Woods [West Australian Opera and Northern Ireland Opera].

Opera credits include Eugene Onegin, The Juniper Tree and La Boheme [Northern Ireland Opera], La Traviata, Rigoletto and L'elisir d'amore [Diva Opera].

Eleanor White | Dramaturg

Eleanor is a dramaturg and script consultant from Dublin. She is currently Development Executive at Deadpan Pictures.

Prior to joining the Deadpan team in 2022, Eleanor was Literary Manager at the Traverse Theatre in Edinburgh, where she drove all aspects of the commissioning process and the development of new writers of all levels. Work for the Traverse includes Wilf, This is Paradise, Still, The Monstrous Heart and Crocodile Fever, in addition to many developmental readings and work-in-progress sharings.

Other credits as Dramaturg include The Hare [Once Off Productions and Cairde Arts Festival], The Saviour [Landmark Productions], The Country Girls [Abbey Theatre], Richard III [as Associate Dramaturg, Druid Theatre Company].

She is currently acting as Dramaturg on another new musical in development: Lourdes! The Musical! [Xnthony Ltd].

Eleanor has been a script reader for a number of leading UK and Irish companies and has worked in the literary departments of Irish Arts Center and Signature Theatre Company in New York. She was the inaugural recipient of Druid's prestigious Marie Mullen Bursary.
