Along with Branar's ensemble of actors he has created and directed all of Branar's 20 original shows. He founded and runs Branar's "AG ROINNT" theatre resource sharing scheme and the TINY SHOWS weekends. Branar and Marc were the Theatre Artist in Residence in Mary Immaculate College of Education in Limerick. Marc was formally a Board member at TYA Ireland, Meitheal na mBeag, Macnas and An Taibhdhearc. Marc was a member of the 9 person panel that presented Galway 2020's bid to the international judging panel in 2016. Prior to setting up Branar Marc taught at primary and second level for some years. Marc holds an MA in Gaeilge and HdipEd

Maeve Clancy is an artist who works in installation, animation and comics. She creates work for children and adults using cut paper, stories and drawings. She has worked on music videos, mounted solo exhibitions and writes fictional. documentary and historical comics. Her current work involves telling the story of Rouba and Noura Merzah, two refugees from Syria. She is currently the Visual Artist in Residence in Contemporary Drawing at Mary Immaculate College.

Michael is the Musical Director of Galway Community Circus' Galway 2020 spectacle Wires Crossed.
